

OVER IN CAMDEN

* While coupling cars at Newfield yesterday Brakeman Michael J. Ryan had one of his hands crushed. Amputation was necessary.

* The Jewish residents of Camden celebrated Rosh-Hoshana, their New Year's Day, in Furey's Hall at Fourth street and Kaighn avenue, yesterday.

* Excise Inspector Price has instructed Camden saloonkeepers to keep their places closed during the special election to-day.

* William Mattson, of 219 Friends avenue, swore out a warrant before Mayor Westcott yesterday charging Annie E. Bradley, a colored servant, with stealing \$185 from him. Annie's whereabouts are not known.

* Judge Armstrong will hold a session of Naturalization Court for the next three days. This will be the last opportunity for naturalization prior to the fall election.

* In the Circuit Court yesterday a non-suit was granted in the contract case of John Chambers against Charles C. Miller.

* Charles Pettit, Clarence Hann and Norris Clark, boys, were held in bail by the Mayor yesterday, charged with stealing \$1 from the till of Mrs. Kerschimer, of Broadway and Clinton.

* The will of Mary Horan, against which a caveat had been filed, was ordered probated by Judge Armstrong in the Orphans' Court yesterday. The estate amounts to about \$3000, and is left to two nieces and a nephew.

* Contractor Pfeiffer will turn on water to-day to test the new stand pipe at Kaighn Hill, but the water will not be available for use throughout the city before next Monday.

* The commission of Public Instruction last evening increased the salaries of the janitors in the Lincoln, Central, Genes and Liberty Schools to \$1000. The U. S. Grant School will be opened on December 1.

* Two-year-old John Murschell, of 2001 Broadway, was run over by a trolley car in front of his home yesterday afternoon and had his left arm cut off.

* The Finance Committee of City Council last evening instructed Comptroller Huddy to order the removal of city telephones from the residences of W. H. Tice and Ben Lawton, whose terms as Councilmen expired six months ago.
