

ACCIDENTS OF THE DAY.

A Big List of Victims of the Firecracker and Pistol.

Charles Halch, 11 years old, living on Friendship street, above State road, Tacony, was accidentally shot in the right leg by Frank Burkhardt. He was taken home.

Louis Sheppard, aged 29 years, of 1826 Naudain street, accidentally shot himself in the hand with a heavy calibre navy revolver, while firing a salute. He was taken to the Pennsylvania Hospital and the physicians extracted the bullet. The wound was of such a serious character that it was deemed advisable for Sheppard to remain in the institution.

William McCarter, 57 years old, of 2113 Christian street, while sitting on the steps in front of his home last night was shot in the left leg, above the knee, by an unknown party.

Joseph Abrahams, 17 years of age, of 1826 Bolgrade street, was seriously injured about the face by a musket barrel exploding while he was discharging it. He was taken to the Episcopal Hospital.

Albert P. Barnes, of 323 Cypress street, was severely burned about the face by a blazing cardboard from a pin-wheel being accidentally thrown at him by George Craig, of 333 South Fourth street. Craig is under arrest.

The following accidents, due to the reckless handling of firearms and Chinese crackers were treated yesterday at the Pennsylvania Hospital:

Caleb Wilson, 21 years old, of 833 Bainbridge street, bullet wound of the hand.

James Lane, 17 years of age, of 605 Paul avenue, pistol wound of the wrist.

Walter H. Smallwood, 17 years, living on Rodman street, pistol wound of the hand.

James Stewart, 28 years old, of 238 Market street, contused wound of the eyeball, caused by the premature explosion of firecrackers.

James Warfield, aged 22 years, of 627 Locust street, wound of the hand, sustained while playing with firecrackers.

The following victims of firearms were admitted to the Cooper Hospital, Camden, yesterday:

Martin Frand, of 571 Royden street, forefinger blown off and face and eyes burned by the premature discharge of a cannon.

Edward Weston, of 747 Berkley street, lacerated wound of the hand, caused by a cannon shot.

Allie Bechtel, a lad, 704 Lime street, wound of the face, caused by a gun shot.

George H. Johnson, colored, aged 31 years, living at 811 Locust street, eye destroyed and in a precarious condition, the result of the careless handling of a revolver by Herman Testmeir. The ball was removed by Dr. Macuen.

Samuel Cover, aged 15 years, 580 Benson street, face and eyes burned from fireworks.
