

CAMDEN NEWS NOTES

** The Firemen's Mutual Benevolent Association at its annual meeting yesterday elected these officers: President, Rallo Jones; vice presidents, Charles Worthington and William O. Sawyer; recording secretary, Peter Gray; financial secretary, William Rose.

** During the past month there have been only two cases of typhoid fever in Camden.

** Judge Endicott yesterday appointed Geo. Leathwhite, Charles Laird, Sr., and Thomas Bell a commission to assess benefits derived from the construction of new sewers.

** Recorder's Clerk William Knight, recently elected president of the Second Ward Republican Club, gave the members a luncheon last night.

** Unusually heavy bail was demanded yesterday by the prosecutor in the case of Charles Fordyce, an alleged disorderly house proprietor, whose place on Kalghu avenue was raided early Sunday morning.
