John P. Kripps, 38 years old, of 1829 South Seventh street, Camden, was shot and killed by Definis Whalen, of 660 Central avenue, yesterday afternoon. A bullet from a rifle struck Kripps over the heart, and he died while being taken to the Cooper Hospital. Although the shooting was declared to be accidental, Whalen disappeared in the excitement, but he surrendered himself last night. The dead man leaves a widow and two

children.
