

CAMDEN NOTES

** The Graft murder trial begins to-morrow. The State issued processes for fifty witnesses yesterday. Constables were busy until late at night obtaining service.

** Charles Hoffman, charged with burglary in Montgomery county, Pa., and arrested by Detective Painter, has been taken to Pennsylvania on a requisition.

** In attempting to evict the family of Abrahamson, 147 Spruce street, Sergeant-at-Arms Hinger, of the District Court, had to kick in the front door to gain admission, and before he could remove the goods he had to secure the aid of the police.

** Frederick Hickman, aged 8 years, of 234 Senate street, Camden, ran a pitch pine splinter through the calf of his leg while sliding down a cellar door. Cooper Hospital surgeons had to etherize the lad before the splinter could be removed.

** Policeman John Chambers, of the Seventh ward, Camden, was suspended until trial by the Police Committee of City Council, by Mayor Nowrey, yesterday. The report of Captain Stanley to the Mayor charged Chambers with being intoxicated while on duty on Friday. When brought before the Mayor yesterday the policeman said he was not drunk, but exhausted by the loss of sleep while doing extra duty at a colored ball.

** Thomas and Spencer Tilton, trading as the New Jersey Butter and Egg Company, and John Schlorer, of Merchantville, were each fined \$100 and costs by Justice Schmitz, in Camden, yesterday, on the charge of selling unstamped oleomargarine. The complaints were made by Inspector Townsend, of the State Dairy Commissioner's Department. The cases will be appealed.
