

CAMDEN NEWS NOTES

** A 12-horse power launch, valued at \$700 and owned by Michael Howlett, of 2305 North Broad street, Philadelphia, was stolen on Thursday night from its anchorage at the foot of Twenty-ninth street. The Camden police have traced the stolen boat to Chester.

** Permits for the erection of three additions to the plant of the Armstrong Cork Co. were issued yesterday by the City Clerk. The buildings are to be 23x70, 23x39 and 20x150 feet.

** Assemblyman and Mrs. Joseph Potter will sail today for England. They will remain abroad several months.

** Miss Nellie Leaming and Miss Nettie Potter will represent Camden at the convention of the American Librarian's Association at Bretton Woods, N. H., on June 28.

** The National Tobacco Company, with a capital stock of \$150,000, filed articles of incorporation in the Camden County Clerk's office yesterday. The incorporators are M. M. Wilson, J. T. Sutton and Charles Bridge.

** At a meeting of the Camden County Republican Executive Committee yesterday afternoon plans were laid for the election of a new Executive Committee under the provisions of the new primary act.

** Two rings, one containing 13 diamonds and the other a circle of diamonds, have mysteriously disappeared from the home of Samuel Winley, Mt. Ephraim and Atlantic avenues. The police are investigating and are looking for a woman servant, who disappeared at the time the gems were missed.
