

THREATEN JAIL FOR AUTO SPEED DEFIANCE

Three Arrests Are Made in Camden and on White Horse Pike, "Broad- way" to Shore

White Horse pike, the "Broadway" to the seashore, was traversed by clouds of automobiles yesterday. From Camden all the way down agents of the State Motor Vehicle Department were on the alert as a result of an appeal made by Prosecutor Kraft, following complaints of residents along the road who have had their lives endangered by the speed fiends.

State Inspector Pedigree patrolled the road as far as Elm. Two arrests were made and thousands were warned against speeding.

George A. Huhn, 3d, of Overbrook, was fined \$50 by Justice Danaker, of Elm, for exceeding the speed limit and failing to display a registration tag. Joseph Eddelman, of Yonkers, N. Y., was fined \$10 by the same justice, for exceeding the speed limit. Robert W. Hensley, of Darby, was arrested by Motorcycle Policeman Frost, in Camden, for going faster than twelve miles an hour on a motorcycle in Camden. He gave security for a hearing before Recorder Stackhouse today.

Prosecutor Kraft has found that while the great majority of autoists do not try to "burn-up" the pike, there are some who endanger the careful ones by recklessness. Both he and the State motor agents assert they will not only impose fines, but will see that jail sentences are imposed for flagrant and persistent violations.
