

CAMDEN NEWS NOTES

** Falling at a North Camden garage, where he was employed, Walter Langdon, aged 17 years, of Fifth and Market streets, cut a gash in his throat with the blade of an open knife which he held in his hand.

** The Board of Health yesterday sent out notices to owners of property along Line Ditch meadow citing them to appear at a meeting next Monday, when steps will be taken looking to the abatement of the long existing nuisance, due to the low lands. Mayor Ellis and City Council are in sympathy with any action the Board may take.

** A weight so badly crushed Michael Powers' right foot at the New York ship yard yesterday that it was found necessary at Cooper Hospital to amputate two toes.

** Lorgan & Hurley yesterday took out a permit for the erection of a row of nine houses from 319 to 335 North Eighth street. A permit for nine dwellings on Ninth street south of Mechanic street, was also issued.

** After being unconscious for a week in Cooper Hospital, George Hubert, aged 14 years, of Third and Berkley streets, died yesterday afternoon. The cause of death was uraemia, which doctors say is an unusual ailment for one so young.

** City Detective William Hart is seriously ill at his home, 412 South Fifth street. He is in a very weakened condition.

** His application for a new trial denied, Edward Nelson was yesterday sentenced by Judge Joline, in Camden Criminal Court, to nine months in the State Prison at hard labor for assault and battery on Charles Smith. Several years ago Nelson was acquitted of a charge of murdering Policeman Danny Lee.
