## MURDERER GLAD HE KILLED HIS WIFE

in the room, Samuel Vanstavern, who murdered his wife in Camden on Friday evening, was given a hearing by Justice Stackhou-c yesterday and committed to await the action of the grand jury.

"I hope she is dead and I am willing to hang for it," was Vanstavern's expres-

sion shortly after his arrest, and his coun-tenance at the hearing gave no indication that he regretted the deed When asked by Justice Stackhouse if he desired to say anything, Vanstavern gruff ly mambled: "I am't got nothin' to say."

He made a statement, however, on Fri-day evening to Assistant Prosecutor Archcr. He said he had been separated from

his wife for nine years, although they had been friendly at times during that period. He had coaxed her frequently to return He had coaxed her frequently to return to him, but she always had some excuse. Four of five weeks ago he said she in-formed him that she had sold their household goods and all was over between

"I couldn't live without her," he said, and if she is dead I am glad and am willing to hang for it."

He said he had been drinking Friday.

He had purchased the pistol several weeks ago and always kept it with him. "I didn't know whether I would have shot her if I hadn't been dirnking." he con-

fright and denied that he knew her. The woman hearing the hoy's cries turned and Vanstavern convinced that she was his wife, began firing. Mrs. Vanstavern sought shelter behind an oil box, but her husbard followed her, firing four shots, each of them taking effect.

Married Seventeen Years The Vanstaverns had been married seventeen years. They had one child, Walter, now 16 years old. Mrs. Vanstavern was always considered an estimable woman while her husband had a reputation for
