

LOU PALUSO SCORES BIG HIT WITH VICTORY IN BOSTON

FRANKIE CONWAY DEFEATED BY S. L. BOY

**Local Youngster Scores Hit
When He Beats Classy
Philadelphia Feather**

BOSTON, Mass., Oct. 17.—Lou Paluso, Jack Dempsey's sensational feather-weight protege from Salt Lake City, did two things in the Boston arena here last night. He won a ten round decision over Frankie Conway, the classy Philadelphia feather, and at the same time he made a home for himself in Boston.

Paluso has fought in Boston before and each time he has shown to better advantage, winning every fight, beating better boys and doing it with more and more cleverness. Last night he reached new heights. It was his first appearance here this season and fans remembering his good work last winter, gave him a hearty hand.

SHOWS WELL.

Paluso started his ten-round battle with Conway, who is a mighty good boy, rather slowly, but as he warmed up, he took the aggressive and by the time the bout had reached the fifth round he was going strong and had the fight about even.

In the final rounds, Paluso made his big hit and won the fight. He brought the fans to their feet by his great display of cleverness, rocking the Philadelphia youth time and again with left hooks and hard right hand punches. Conway was punch drunk and weary when the gong rang, ending the contest. Paluso was given the unanimous decision of both the referee and the judges. Seldom has a visiting boxer received such an ovation as Paluso, when he left the ring.

GOING BACK.

Paluso left immediately after the bout for New York, where he is under the management and supervision of Leo F. Flynn, the greatest of all fight managers. Flynn has some other bouts lined up for Paluso but his following in Boston will demand that he return here in a short time and meet some other good boy.
