

FORD, FOR MURDER, IS PUT TO DEATH

Charles Ford of Camden, who killed Mrs. May E. Wagner and wounded Robert M. Wilson, was electrocuted at the State Prison last night. He was given the greatest voltage of any of the 27 men put to death at the institution.

Ford was accompanied to the death chair by the Rev. Albert C. Busch, pastor of the Second Presbyterian Church, this city, and the Rev. Edward L. Stern, a member of the Anti-Saloon League.

In a letter prepared by Ford for a sister in Atlantic City he asked that no autopsy be held on his body.

It required 1,900 volts and 12 amperes to kill Ford and he was in the chair for ten minutes before being pronounced dead. He was of powerful build and his body offered great resistance to the current. In former cases only 1,800 volts were given.
