Those Phillies Lose Another Engagement at Piratetown

PITTSBURG, Pa., May 25.—There was all kinds of excitement in to-day's game, but Mr. Stallings' men were not in the hunt at any stage. Rhines was a puzzle at all times. Lajole alone being able to solve the giant twirler. Ganzel questioned a decision on Boyle's triple, claiming it was foul and he was sent to the bench. Cross and Boyle found fault with the base decisions of Referee Andrews, while the Pirates strenuously objected to the manner in which Emslie called balls and strikes. Douglass was badly hurt in the sixth inning. He beat out an infield hit and then stole second. In sliding his right foot caught on the bag and was badly wrenched. Stallings took his place on the bases, scoring a run. Boyle was then sent to first base and McFarland took Boyle's place behind the bat.

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"Bad Bill" Eagan made another record to-day. He went to bat five times, reaching first twice on balls, once on an error and twice on safe hits, scoring three runs. In the field he accepted every chance, making several brilliant plays. Gray and Brodie batted Donohue hard. Nash and Cross especially found Rhines a puzzle, they each striking out twice. Cooley played a brilliant game in the field, cutting off several three-base hits. Lajole, besides batting well, fielded in magnificent style at times.

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Pittsburg started to score in the first inning. Eagan reached first on Cross' fumble, Donovan made a single and Gray beat out a bunt. In handling the bunt Lajole threw wild, Gray going to second and Eagan scoring. Donovan scored on McCarthy's out. Lajole to Douglass. Gray scored on Davis' long fly to Cooley. Ganzel singled, but Ely was forced at second, Cross to Lajole. In the second inning Schriver started the natives by beating out a bunt and went to second on Rhines' sacrifice. Eagan dropped a lucky two-base hit in left. Donovan got a base on balls. McCarthy singled, Schriver and Eagan scoring. Pittsburg scored another run in the sixth. Schriver singled and stole second, but was caught on Rhines' little hit. Rhines moved up a peg when Eagan got a base on balls and scored on Gray's single. After Rhines had been retired in the eighth inning Eagan hit safely. Donovan flew to right, but Gray again hit safely, scoring Eagan. Gray stole second and scored on McCarthy's single.

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The Quakers first scored in the fourth inning. Douglass walked and Delahanty reached first on Ganzel's wild throw. Lajole doubled Delahanty, but the Phillies questioned the decision, and they had ground, too. Flick walked. Boyle sent one over first base, scoring Douglass and Flick, Boyle reaching third. Ganzel claimed the ball was foul, and his objections being offensive to Emslie, the first baseman retired from the game. The visitors made their third and last run in the sixth inning. Douglass beat out a bunt and stole second, hurting his leg. Stallings took his place and scored on Lajole's single. Score:
