FIRE AND POLICE FORCES INCREASED

New Men to Be Added to Each Department in Camden-Move Against the "Pennsy"

At last night's meeting of Camden City Council the police force was increased to 130 men, as follows: 1 chief, 3 captains, 2 house captains, 9 sergeants, 4 detectives, 10 patrol crew, 101 policemen, an increase of 25 men. By ordinance the ' following new firemen were appointed: Ephraim T. Hires, First ward; Charles Schultz, Second ward; Gardner Corson. Fourth ward; Gilbert Hibbs, Seventh ward; John H. Lennox, Ninth ward; Newton Asb, Tenth ward, Dr. A. Haines Elppincott was appointed police surgeon by Mayor Charles H. Ellis.

Resolutions of sympathy on the illness of Councilman Besser were expressed in a rising vote. The ordinance which pro-vided for an increase of salary of every city official was not introduced. The highest increase was \$1000 for the Mayor and the lowest \$300 for a clerkship. A resolution was adopted that a com-
