

THE FIRST NEW JERSEY DISTRICT.

The Election of Congressional Delegates in Robeson's Old District.

The Republican primaries in Camden for the election of delegates to the Congressional Convention in the First New Jersey district passed off very quietly last evening, there being no trouble anywhere except in the Third ward, where Dudley delegates were elected and the two inspectors of the election boards, Frank Turner and William Parker, both Hiresmen, refused to sign the credentials and left the polls without doing so. It is said they will be arrested to-morrow.

The three candidates for the Congressional nomination are George Hires, of Salem, Thomas H. Dudley, of Camden, and John W. Newlin, of Millsville. In Camden city Hires got 21 delegates, Dudley, 16, Newlin, 1.

Eighth Ward—All for Dudley—Jesse Pratt, William J. Thompson, Thomas B. Wood, Richard J. Chandler, Lawrence Rhodes.

Other returns are incomplete, but it is known that the Second ward of Gloucester City gave five delegates to Dudley, Delaware township five to Dudley, and Merchantville two to Dudley and three to Hires, thus making totals, as far as returns are received, as follows: Hires, 26, Dudley, 23, Newlin, 1.
