

FIREMEN TO PARADE IN GLOUCESTER CITY

Fifteen Companies to Participate
In Pageant Saturday When New
Engine Is Housed

GLOUCESTER CITY, N. J., May 6.—At a meeting of the Board of Fire Commissioners and Fire Department today arrangements were completed for the firemen's parade to be held on Saturday in connection with the housing of the new fire engine. About fifteen fire companies will participate, and Mayor Mealey, who is chief of the fire department, will be marshal, with William Krown and Thomas Cogan as his aides.

The parade will start from the hose house on Bergen street. At the reviewing stand, in front of the City Hall, the judges will decide the winners. The judges will be Sheriff Joseph E. Nowrey, Mayor Charles Ellis, of Camden; Mayor Milliard F. Cattell, of Woodbury; Chief Worthington, of the Camden Fire Department, and Chief Baxter, of Philadelphia. Jennings' Band will head the line, followed by the city officials in automobiles.

The Boy Scouts will assist in patrolling the route, along with a number of Camden police. Prizes will be awarded for the company having the largest number of men in line; the company coming the furthest distance; the company having the best band, and the best equipped company.
