

STILL NO CLUE TO BANDITS

Police Unable to Catch Up to Desperadoes Who Invaded Camden

The Camden police are still running out clues that might lead to the detection of the band of robbers that terrorized Pavonia early last Saturday morning. Nothing of any consequence had developed up to a late hour last night. Harry Curtis, detective of the Pennsylvania Railroad, was detailed yesterday to look over the score or so of suspects that have been arrested in various parts of New Jersey.

The recent visit of the bandits has caused such alarm among residents of Pavonia that Mayor Nowrey has appointed Jacob Handley a special officer to patrol the lonely streets at night. Business people who petitioned the Mayor have promised to foot the bill.
