

OVER IN CAMDEN

Andrew Collins, indicted for policy selling, in whose case a jury disagreed, was brought into court yesterday by Assistant Prosecutor Carson, who advised him to plead guilty and throw himself on the mercy of the court. Collins refused to do so.
