

WITNESS ABUSED, TWO ARRESTS MADE

Alleged Intimidation of a Man Who Testified Against Sun- day Liquor Sellers

He Asked for Protection and Was Accompanied by a Policeman in Plain Clothes

Two men are locked up in the Camden City Hall. It is alleged that they intimidated a witness who appeared before the grand jury yesterday to testify against saloonkeepers charged with Sunday liquor selling. The prisoners are John Kane, 39 years old, a bartender, at Thomas Clayton's saloon, 301 Mechanic street, and John G. Peterson, 57 years old, of 1468 South Third street, who claims to be an advertising solicitor. The witness they are said to have made threats against is Louis Coleman, who resides on North Thirty-sixth street, East Side.

The two men, it is said, first approached Coleman at the Court House, after he had left the grand jury room. He appealed to the authorities for protection, claiming threats had been made against him. Policeman Isaac Lovett, who was in citizens' dress, was detailed to guard Coleman.

Kane and Peterson, it is alleged, followed Coleman about until he got on a trolley car to return home. The men boarded the same car, and so did Officer Lovett. Kane and Peterson, it is said, abused Coleman until the car reached the East Side. Then Officer Lovett seeing Policeman Flick on the street, called to him, and they took the two men in custody. They will have a hearing to-day before Recorder Nowrey.
