

JOTTINGS THROUGH JERSEY

* A case of small-pox has been reported at Riverside.

* The congregation of the Presbyterian church at Bethlehem, Hunterdon county, has decided to erect a handsome parsonage.

* The Flemington Fire Department netted \$1350 by holding a three-days' fair. The proceeds will be used in defraying the expenses of a big firemen's parade on October 6.

* A thief broke into the barber shop of Clarence Crane, at Bridgeton, and stole nine razors and two pairs of shears.

* The annual session of the Grand Lodge of the Legion of the Red Cross will be held in Morgan's Hall, Camden, to-day.

* Edward McDonald, who played the Carrie Nation act in the saloon of Daniel Considine, in Camden, Saturday night, was given three months in the county jail by the Recorder yesterday.

* Representative Loudenslager has been advised that a pension of \$8 a month has been granted to Mary C. Robbins, of Camden.

* Representative Howell has introduced a bill for the relief of Henry A. Tolbert, of Barnegat, who was surety for his son, Harry W. Tolbert, who defaulted in a contract to build a guard house at Fort Mott, N. J. The father was obliged to pay \$3185, and he seeks Congressional relief now.

* Justice Schmitz, in Camden, last night, committed Robert Wieshing and Harry Martin to the county jail in default of bail, charged with assault and battery on Frank Stockton, son of Fireman John Stockton. Stockton was attacked at Third street and Kaighn avenue, Saturday night, and terribly beaten.
