Five persons, an unconscious fire captain, a paralyzed woman and three little children, were carried to safety shortly before 9 o'clock yesterday morning when fire gutted the third floor of the apartment house at 417 Vine street. David Baird Robinson, an assistant deputy surrogate, braved the flames

The fire was caused by an over-heated hot plate and gutted the third floor of 417 and hadly damaged the top floor of the house at 415. Household effects owned by William E. Curtis, E. F. Crane, B. E. Lame and William Carey, occupants of their apartments. were damaged by smoke and water. The apartments are owned by J. W. Young and the loss is placed at \$3000.
