

JOITINGS FROM CAMDEN.

The Mount Vernon School House (colored), which has been closed since last summer, was reopened last night.

Joseph Mount and Charles Carpenter will have a hearing to-day on the charge of robbing the jewelry store at 626 Kaighn avenue.

Alfred Robinson shot William Camper in the thigh yesterday during a quarrel. Robinson was arrested and Camper sent to the Cooper Hospital.

Harry Ware, acting brakeman on the Williamstown and Delaware River Railroad, while drilling cars yesterday fell beneath the wheels and was killed. His body is at Coroner Jefferis' office.

An unknown woman, apparently 50 years of age, was struck by a train on the West Jersey Railroad shortly after 6 o'clock last night near Line Ditch crossing and instantly killed. She wore a black and white plaid shawl, calico dress and lace shoes. Her body is at the morgue.

The body found in a box in Johnson's Cemetery, Camden, with a rope around the neck, was reinterred yesterday, the authorities giving up all hope of solving the mystery. The cemetery keeper has been discharged. The remains of Mrs. Mary J. Walters have not yet been found and her daughter will enter suit, as will Prosecutor Jenkins, for burying bodies less than four feet below the surface.
