

CAMDEN POLITICS DULL

Not Much Interest Manifested in the Spring Campaign

Very little interest has been taken so far in the coming municipal election in Camden, although it is only five weeks off. The Republican City Executive Committee will meet next Tuesday evening to fix dates for the primaries. The Democrats will decide on Wednesday evening upon the dates for their primaries.

A contest for ward supremacy is being waged between the Sayrs and Hanson factions of the Republican party in the Seventh ward. Assistant Postmaster Charles P. Sayrs is supporting City Committeeman John H. Carmany for the Councilmanic nomination, while the Councilman, James Hanson, Jr., is backing Isaac V. Bradley, brother of Assemblyman Bradley.

Attorney Samuel P. Jones has entered the contest for the Republican nomination for Council in the First ward to succeed Councilman Jesse Bond. Former Councilman Robert Smith is also an aspirant for the position.

William B. Carter wants to succeed Councilman Arnold, of the Eleventh ward.
