

LAMBERT HAS BUT A MONTH TO LIVE

BAKER KAIRER'S MURDERER TO
BE HANGED IN CAMDEN ON
JUNE 27.

A SECOND DEATH WARRANT

Lawyer Semple Will Again Try to
Stop the Execution by Appealing
to the Supreme Court, But There
Is Not Much Prospect of Success.
Other Jersey Matters

Governor Werts yesterday issued another death warrant in the case of Theodore Lambert, the Camden colored burglar who murdered Baker William G. Kairer while robbing his house. Thursday, June 27, is the date fixed for the execution, but Lawyer John L. Semple, who secured a stay from the United States Supreme Court on the eve of the day first fixed for the execution, says he has a card up his sleeve that will again win the trick.

He says he will go to Trenton next Tuesday and apply either for a writ of habeas corpus or a writ of certiorari to test the legality of the death warrant before the court. He claims that the Governor has no right to order Lambert hanged, but he must

again be sentenced by the Supreme Court.

Attorney General Stockton and other prominent lawyers disagree with Lawyer Semple, and say that inasmuch as the State courts and the United States Supreme Court have dismissed the murderer's appeals there is absolutely no prospect of legal interference to prevent the execution.

Sheriff Barrett will again put a death watch on duty at Lambert's cell. Preparations for the hanging having all been made, the Sheriff has little to do but to await the date for trying his hand at launching a murderer into eternity.

Lambert was not surprised when he was informed yesterday of the Governor's action. He had been told by his counsel that another death warrant would be issued. He has the most implicit confidence in Lawyer Semple's ability to save him from the gallows.

Lambert has grown much stouter than he was when arrested. He keeps up his religious professions.
