

WANTS ANOTHER TRIAL.

Lawyer Semple Trying to Save Lambert From the Gallows.

Trenton, Nov. 19.—Lawyer John L. Semple, of Camden, to-day made what will probably be the final effort to save Theodore Lambert from the gallows. Lambert is the colored burglar who was convicted of shooting Baker William G. Kairer. He is sentenced to be hanged in Camden early in December. Argument was presented to Chancellor McGill on an application for a writ of error to obtain a new trial. The Chancellor reserved his decision.

Lawyer Semple presented four objections to the conviction of Lambert. He claimed first that the list of jurors was defective, as it did not definitely locate their residences. Second, that the jurors were not drawn according to the statute. Third, that the Court erred in overruling a motion to challenge the array of jurors. Fourth, that the verdict was contrary to the evidence, and the killing was not done in the commission of a felony. Exceptions to the judge's charge were also presented to the Chancellor.
