Governor Werts, of New Jersey, has fixed December 19 as the date for the execution of Theodore Lambert, the Camden colored murdere. The Governor departed from the ancient tradition of fixing Friday as hang-

tradition of fixing Friday as hangman's day, for the 19th will be Thursday. He skined the death warrant yesterday afternoon, at Trenton. This is the third time Governor Werts has affixed his signature to an order for The date first fixed for the execution was December '13, 1894, which was a

little over a year from the time Lambert shot William G. Kairer, the Camden cracker baker, while robbing his house in South Camden. Through John L. Semple, his counsel, the Governor granted a reprieve until January J. 1895. His counsel

until January 5, 1895. His counsel then contested the legality of the reprieve on constitutional grounds, and the case was taken to the Supreme Court. The United States Supreme Court decided that the reprieve was legal.

Governor Werts issued another death warrant, fixing June 27 last ps the time for Lambert's execution. Another appeal was taken to the United States Supreme Court, Lawyer Semple. Claiming the Governor had no authorisation of the Court was decided in November 18, against the prisoner.
