Charles H. Ellis and Miss Hattie Wèber, of Lewistown, Pa., Quietly Married

Without the least show of ostentation or display, Charles H. Ellis, Mayor of Camden, and Miss Hattie B. Weber, of Selevistown, Pa, were united in marriage last night at the home of the Macro, PiJS South Fifth street. The wedding was stretly private. The externony was performed by Rev. Holmes F. Gravatt, pastor of the, First M. E. Church, Camden. The Mayor and his bride were attended by his son and daughter. Frank M. Ellis and Miss Ella T. Ellis, and immediately after the ceremony the Chief Executive and his wife departed on a trip South. They are schulded to return home on

May 20.

The bride is a daughter of the late John and Catherine Weber and a niece of S. B. Weber, a banker and merchant at Lewistown.

Being a stockler for simplicity, the Mayor endeavord to keep his marriage plans secret, but his intentions leaked out among his associates at the municipal building, and the bride was the recipient yesterday of a chest of silver.
