Loan Shark Bill Nets GOP Support

Staff Writer The Hughes administration has won the support of Republican Senate leaders for an anti-loan shark bill which carries the same prison term as second degree murder.
The bill, introduced yester-

day, makes it a special crime for a loan shark to kill, kidnap, injure or threaten harm to anyone to collect a debt. The penalty is a \$100,000


The attorney general's of-

The Republican Legislature, faced with a proposed budget containing a surplus of only \$5.4 million, is getting ready to spend \$1 million of it. Gov. Richard J. Hughes

yesterday vetoed a Republican bill appropriating \$1,390,00 for beach protection work in Cape May and said he could accept only \$895,000 be-cause of the tight budget. The Assembly quickly approved the reduced appropriation and sent it to the Senate.

Meanwhile, the Senate released from committee for a vote Monday an administration bill appropriating \$331,000 to the State Police and National Guard for riot control equipment — guns, search lights and radio equipment.

An equivalent grace period is allowed in replacing privies, and farmers are permitted the option of installing com-bustion or chemical toilets. The law required flush toilets unless privies were proven superior because of soil conditions.

Senate Republican leaders stalled by 1970 was dropped. The labor commissioner is empowered to require such facilities by regulation.

Instead of daily garbage collections, camps would be required to collect garbage "as often as necessary."

In addition to permitting the state to make hardship exceptions, as the law does already, the bill permits the commissioner to grant exceptions when "necessary to obtain a beneficial use of an existing camp" or "prevent a practical difficulty."

It requires the commissoner to classify violations as to "seriousness" and set deadlines for compliance accordingly.

GOP Holds Fire On

Tax Plans

By DICK GALE Staff Writer Republicans in the New Jer-

sey Legislature are withholding partisan fire on Gov. Richard J. Hughes' promise to risk proposing new taxes. but they are pressing ahead in their Congressional redistricting fight with the governor.

GOP Senate leaders took a "wait-and-see" position after the governor accepted the political risk of recommending new taxes to finance the social programs he will propose in mid-April, partly in response to his special riot commission's "Report for Action.

Senate President Edwin B Forsythe (R-Burlington) said "the people have a long way to go" before accepting higher taxes. A "massive education would be required, added Majority Leader Frank X. McDermott (R-Union).

A fixed position against new or higher taxes would be irresponsible, observed Scn. Harry Sears (R-Morris), chairman of the Joint Appropriations Committee.

Republicans want to see the details of the tax proposals. Hughes gave no indication of how much or what kind of tax rise he has in mind.

Vote Monday On the redistricting front, the Assembly scheduled a vote Monday on Hughes' veto of a bill redistricting Bergen County.

The Senate overrode the veto, 29 to 9, two more than the two-thirds necessary. Sen. Matthew J. Rinaldo (R-Union) joined the Democrats in opposition, and Sen. Frank Italiano (R-Camden) abstained. Both come from districts would also like the lines

If the Assembly also overrides the veto, Rep. Henry Helstoski (D-Bergen) is in the state courts against the redistricting.

Hughes' veto message argued that the Legislature has no power to change a districting plan the courts have found constitutionally valid. The new GOP district violates the requirement of contiguity and compactness and is a clear gerrymander, the message


