

CAMDEN NEWS NOTES

*In an attempt to rob the saloon of John Carroll, northeast corner Third and Cherry streets, Camden, early yesterday morning Ernest Baker, colored, aged 31 years, of 770 Haight avenue, was shot by the former and dangerously wounded. Two other men accompanied Baker, one of whom, Frank Johnson, also colored, was captured. The other man escaped. Baker was taken to the Cooper Hospital, where it was found the bullet had entered through his right eye. His condition is serious. Johnson was taken to the City Hall and held without bail by the Recorder.

*The members of the Camden County Bar in Camden yesterday paid their respects to the late ex Judge David J. Pancoast and Colonel James Matlack Scovel, who were for years prominent lawyers. A committee composed of Howard M. Cooper, Herbert A. Drake and E. A. Armstrong presented a minute on ex-Judge Pancoast and Howard Carrow. John F. Harned and F. A. Rex did the same on Colonel Scovel. Both were glowing tributes to the deceased lawyers.

*Miss Grace H. Titus, for many years a teacher in Northeast School, who died Saturday, was buried from her late home, 416 North Sixth street, Camden, yesterday. Four of her nephews acted as pall-bearers. Rev. Dr. Marshall Owens had charge of the services. Interment was made in Colestown Cemetery.

*Joshua Raynard, colored, who struck Benjamin Jenkins, also colored, on the head with a brick, resulting in the latter being blinded in one eye, was convicted by a jury before Judge Joline yesterday on a charge of atrocious assault and battery.

*Louis Roberts, aged 29 years, of 1113 Carpenter street, fell down an elevator shaft at Danenhower's warehouse yesterday, resulting in his receiving severe lacerations and bruises.

*William Smith, aged 29 years, of 3447 Emerald street, Philadelphia was badly injured about the back yesterday by a brick falling on him from the third story of the Victor Talking Machine Building. He was taken to the Cooper Hospital.

*Charged with stealing and pawning some of his mother's clothing, Edward Conroy, colored, was held in \$200 bail by Recorder Stackhouse yesterday.
