Attorney General John W. Wescott and Prosecutor William J. Kraft, in Camden, yesterday jointly celebrated their natal anniversaries. Both are Democrats and are close personal friends. The Attorney General was born in 1847 and the Prosecutor in 1870. They were the recipients of the felicitations of their host of friends and each was the guest of the other at an informal luncheon. Mr. Kraft will step out of office on March 14 to be succeeded by Speaker of the House Charles A. Wolverton, who was an assistant to Prosecutor Henry S. Scovel some years ago. Mr. Kraft will resume his private law practice with his son, Bayard, who is now in France, and Wayne, who has been associated with his father in the Prosecutor's office.
