

WOODWARD TO GO TO GALLOWS ON JANUARY 7

Camden Murderer Hears His
Doom With a Smile, Then
Curses Wildly

VISITED BY PARENTS

They Tell the Prisoner an Effort
to Secure Life Imprisonment
Will Be Made

Justice Garrison in Camden yesterday sentenced Paul Woodward to be hanged on January 7 for the murder of John Coffin and Walter Price Jennings near Haddon Heights on October 1.

Smiled, Then Swore

When sentence was pronounced Woodward smiled. As Sheriff Mines escorted him across "the bridge of sighs" he uttered vile curses and said that everybody connected with the case was a liar and that he was innocent. The prisoner's counsel withdrew the motion for a new trial. The death watch will be placed on duty to-morrow.

Visited by Parents

Yesterday afternoon the condemned man was visited by his father and mother, who buoyed him up with the statement that every effort will be made to have the Court of Appeals commute his sentence to life imprisonment. So far the young murderer has refused to have a spiritual adviser.
