## SECOND BOMB FOUND IN CAMDEN LUMBER YARD

Explosives May Have Been Made by "Black Hand" Gang Which Threatened Rich Italian

Within a short distance of the spotwhere a crude bomb was found about a week ago, another one was uncovered yesterday by Alfred Suders, at the lumber and of the Volney-Rennett Company, Second and Spruce streets, Camden It was turned over to Detective Troncone, who fearlessly examined the contrivance He found it was a discarded paint can containing about a quart of powder and, other material, to which was attached a fuse. There was sufficient explosive to blow up a substantial structure. The police kept the bomb pending further investification.

It is not believed than an attempt was made to damage the humber yard, but that the improved bombe were ludden for other work. The police believe the bombs may have something to do with a "black hand" letter which was sent to Jinocenzo Barano, a wealthy unth dealer, of 707 Louts street, some days ago The police hate made several arrests in that dence to bold the risoners enough ev-

The ones who sent the letter demand ed \$500, with the alternative of blowing him and his home up. He lives within two blocks of where the bomb was found and in the midst of the Italian colons.
